Two Emergency Shelters

Women and children escaping abuse and violence have a safe home in our shelters. Yellow Brick House offers 51 beds and cribs.

24/7 Crisis & Support Lines

Counsellors are available 24/7 to help individuals in crisis assess their level of danger and take appropriate action.

Public Education

- Healthy Homes: abuse prevention workshops for newcomers and immigrants to Canada
- Schools for Change Program: abuse prevention workshops for grades 7-12
- Stepping Up: a peer-facilitated program aimed to support post-graduate students in exploring the best ways of helping their peers who may have experienced violence
- Online facilitator training: to assist youth and adults in having discussions about healthy relationships
- Organizational training: Recognizing & Responding to Abuse, Bill 168

Maria's Story

Maria had always been a loving mother to her son, but her life was turned upside down when her husband became physically and emotionally abusive. The abuse started with verbal insults and escalated to physical violence, leaving Maria with bruises and scars she had to hide from her son. She was afraid for her life and her son but also worried about how she would provide for him if she left.

Despite her fear and uncertainty, Maria decided to leave her husband and start a new life with her son. She sought help from Yellow Brick House and enrolled in our Mothers In Mind® parenting program to receive emotional support and learn tools which allowed her to reconnect with her son.

The transition was difficult, and Maria struggled to adjust to life as a single parent. She had to find a job and support her child on her own while dealing with her past trauma. But through it all, she remained committed to her son's well-being and ensured he had a safe and stable home environment.

Over time, Maria's strength and resilience paid off. She found a job that allowed her to support her family and give him the love and attention he deserved. She also continued to work through her trauma, seeking therapy, and support from other survivors of domestic violence.

Through The Citrine Foundation's matching campaign, women like Maria received the necessary support to escape domestic abuse and rebuild their lives. Today, Maria's son is thriving, and she is proud of the life she has built for them. Although the scars of her past remain, she is grateful for the chance to give her child a life free from abuse and fear. Her story is a testament to the power of resilience and the importance of seeking help in times of need.



A woman in Canada is murdered **every 6 days** by her intimate partner.

A woman or child is murdered **every 2 1/2 days** as a result of gender-based violence.






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About Mothers In Mind ®

Mothers In Mind® is a 10-week parenting program for mothers and their young children under the age of four who have experienced violence. Developed by the Child Development Institute in Toronto, the program focuses on helping mothers with an abuse history develop healthy emotional attachments with their children. Witnessing spousal violence is considered a form of child abuse by the RCMP, and exposure to violence can have negative effects on children's brain development, learning, and emotional well-being. Children who witness violence are also more likely to become victims or abusers in the future and have a higher risk of suicide.

Vision

Freedom from violence. Equality for all.

Mission

Yellow Brick House provides life saving services and prevention programs to meet the diverse needs of individuals, families, and communities impacted by violence.

Citrine's Impact

Impact of Mothers in Mind *: The program has significantly impacted our clients, including strengthening their parent-child relationship, parenting skills, and self-efficacy. The program has also helped the survivors to develop healthy communication practices, gain self-confidence and self-compassion, and find a community within the group.

The program provided opportunities for our clients to learn from the experiences of other moms in the group, focus on mindfulness, and better manage their triggers and responses. The program also helped the clients better understand the impact of violence and trauma on themselves and their children, resulting in more positive parenting practices. Women in the group reported that the program changed their perspective on responding to their children with a more positive, mindful approach.

With The Citrine Foundation's support and matching, the Mothers in Mind ® program was funded for one full year. This funding enables the organization to plan and implement the program more effectively, with more resources available. This provides a sense of security for the organization, allowing the staff to focus on delivering the program and supporting the clients rather than worrying about funding and fundraising efforts.

Overall, the impact of The Citrine Foundation funding the Mothers in Mind ® program for one year allowed it to continue delivering its benefits to our clients and helping Yellow Brick House achieve its mission more effectively.
