What if home is a dangerous place to be?


Every six days. That's how often a woman in Canada is *murdered by her intimate partner*.

Yellow Brick House, situated in York Region, serves abused women and children across GTA.

We have two emergency shelters and offer community counselling and supportive programs to women and children not staying in our shelters which include: individual and group counselling, family court support, immigration support and transitional housing support.

We serve **over 6000 women and children** every single year.

You can help women and children escape violence and rebuild their lives.



"When he found out I had been talking with other moms-to-be, he smashed my cell phone. He said I didn't need other friends: I was lucky he loved me, since no one else would want someone like me."



Adults may think that the kids don't know about abuse – but in most cases, they do.

- Domestic violence has significant negative effects on children's emotional, cognitive, social, and behavioral development.
- Children who witness violence in the home have twice the rate of psychiatric disorders as children from non-violent homes.
- Sixty percent of children from violent homes have post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

At Yellow Brick House, we work with children to help them reover from trauma.



What does it take to rebuild a life?

Financial goal: \$775,000

to support unfunded shelter beds per year

Will you make a five-year pledge to help families stay safe?

8 weeks of safety for woman \$14K 8 weeks of safety for woman AND child \$28K 8 weeks of safety for a woman and two children \$42K

safe living space
trauma counselling
parenting classes
group support
legal information access

employment support
transportation
community service referrals
basic housewares
food and clothing

Pre-pandemic Markham shelter had 16 beds and 3 cribs, and Aurora shelter had 25 beds and 7 cribs offering a total of **41 beds and 10 cribs**. Due to the pandemic, we had to convert our congregate shelter space into family zones which reduced our capacity by 30%.

We were successful in securing federal funding to expand our Markham shelter and add 5 more family units which will bring us back to our pre-pandemic capacity. Completion date July 1, 2023.

Our Markham shelter that opened February, 1, 2012, although purchased by MCCSS, *has not received sustainable operating funding*.

- In summary, only 25 beds out of 41 are funded, and we receive \$48,422 per shelter bed
- This leaves us a funding gap of \$775,000 for 16 unfunded beds that we
 are expected to fundraise yearly. In addition the 10 cribs are not funded
- During the pandemic, there has been a national increase of 30% in DV
- In Ontario there has been a 53% increase in domestic homicides.

The need for these beds to remain open is critical as we are only one of the two violence against women agencies in York Region, and these beds save lives.

Yellow Brick House needs your pledge to provide a safe haven for women and children in our shelter. It is important to note that the average duration of stay for a woman in our shelter is approximately 8 weeks. With your invaluable support, we can make a remarkable difference and save lives.
