### A Letter from Our CEO & Board President

Yellow Brick House is grateful for your unwavering commitment to our cause.

As we reflect on the impact of our Yellow Brick House community, we're deeply grateful for the passion and dedication of our staff, volunteers, and donors. Together, we are united in our mission to end intimate partner, domestic, and gender-based violence.

In 2024, 62 women and children in Ontario lost their lives to gender-based violence. These were not just numbers—they were mothers, daughters, sisters, and children—lives full of promise, cut short. The need for safe spaces and life-saving support has never been more urgent.

When a woman experiences violence at home, she's often the one forced to leave—putting her and her children at even greater risk. The first six months after leaving an abusive relationship are the most dangerous. This is why access to emergency shelter and wraparound supports isn't just important—it's life-saving. A bed can mean the difference between safety and danger—between life and death.

But the ongoing housing crisis is making our work even harder. With affordable housing increasingly out of reach, women and children are staying longer in shelters. This strains already limited resources. At Yellow Brick House, we operate 41 beds and 10 cribs—yet only 25 of those beds receive provincial funding. The rest? They stay open because of you.

Your generosity ensures that every woman and child who knocks on our door finds not only a bed, but also find hope, healing, and the strength to rebuild.

As we look ahead, we remain committed to breaking the cycle of violence, promoting systemic change, and walking beside survivors as they build safer, thriving futures.

When I first arrived in this country, I felt lost and uncertain because of everything I had been through. But things got much worse once I was here—my husband's abuse escalated, and both my child and I were really struggling mentally. It was a lot to carry, and my child was deeply affected by the trauma of what was happening between me and her dad. I felt scared, alone, and didn't know where to turn for help.

Someone told me about Yellow Brick House's crisis and support line, and reaching out was the first step toward safety. From that moment, they stood by me with kindness and understanding. They gave me shelter and the support I needed to begin healing. **The mental health counselling made a real difference,** I started to feel more like myself and found the strength to take charge and create a new life for my child and me. Slowly, both my child and I began to find peace and hope again—the stability we needed to move forward.

The support we received changed our lives forever. I can't imagine where we'd be—or if we'd even be alive—if I had stayed. But now, years later, I look at myself and my daughter thriving, and I can only be grateful for Yellow Brick House. 99



## **Event and Campaign Highlights**

#### Celebration of Resilience 2024

Our community of supporters came together at the 2024 May Celebration of Resilience fundraising reception and raised \$200,737 in support of our Nights of Safety program. The evening welcomed 265 guests and featured 12 restaurant stations, all contributing to an impactful night.



# Break The Silence, Step in My Shoes Walk

At our annual Break the Silence Walk, 271 supporters came together at St. Andrew's College in Aurora to take a stand against domestic violence, raising \$77,791 in support of our services.



### #EmpowerHER 2025

In March, 10 local salons joined our #EmpowerHER campaign, raising \$21,391 to support our programs. This was made possible through our partnership with Wella Canada, OPHA, and a \$10,000 match from The Citrine Foundation of Canada. 120 beauty professionals were also trained to recognize signs of domestic violence.





### **Holiday Campaign**

During the holiday season, we raised \$353,163 in support of our Nights of Safety program and received 1,278 in-kind donations from our generous community.

Thanks to Grey Birch Foundation, every dollar went even further, with \$25,000 in matched donations doubling the impact.

#### Sustainable Growth to Meet Community Needs

We completed an internal needs assessment and developed a resource plan to align staffing, infrastructure, and funding with service demands. A new sustainable funding model was initiated to ensure long-term stability and capacity to meet growing community needs.



#### Leadership, Team, and Operational Excellence

Conducted an organizational culture assessment to inform future initiatives. Developed new Human Resources engagement and retention strategies to foster a stronger, more resilient team aligned with our mission and values.



### **Optimizing Program and Service Outcomes and Impacts**

We created a Program and Service Priority Framework to guide future program development and service enhancements. Strategic partnerships were explored to expand access and improve service delivery for our clients.



#### **Expanding and Enhancing Community Engagement**

We launched a new corporate engagement strategy and strengthened our relationships with local municipalities. Board members also played an active role in fostering stakeholder connections and increasing awareness across the community.
