ABOUT YELLOW BRICK HOUSE:

Yellow Brick House is a leading provider of life-saving services to women, families and children who have experienced violence and abuse. We offer emergency shelter, individual, group and child counselling, legal support services, and transitional housing support.

SUMMARY OF POSITION:

The Children's Recreational and Advocacy (CRAW) students assists with providing a recreational program for children who reside at the shelters. This position is centered around providing children with a safe, supportive, and non-violent environment while providing the necessary resources to support mothers and their children who are in the shelter.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- To provide a supportive program over the summer months for children and women within the shelter.
- Organize engaging recreational activities, including creative crafts, storytelling sessions, and both active and quiet games for children.
- Supervise children's outdoor activity daily.
- Supervise children during scheduled in-house women's programs.
- Accompany and introduce children to programs at the local library, park and/or recreational facilities.
- Plan and supervise children on community outings, seasonal events, and local summer festivals.
- Provide mothers with emotional support and information on parenting.
- Assist mothers and children to understand the cycle of violence and the effects of violence and separation on children.
- Other duties as required.
- Some weekend and evening hours may apply.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must meet eligibility requirements for the Canada Summer Jobs Program
- Enrolled in a Social Support Worker/Early Childhood Education program or equivalent is preferred.
- A police reference check is required by the successful candidate prior to hiring.
- Additional languages are considered an asset.

- Strong interpersonal and communication skills
- Ability to demonstrate empathy and conflict management
- Ability to interact effectively with children, families, and colleagues
- Knowledge of child development, trauma-informed care, and issues related to domestic violence is an asset

- Must be reliable, responsible, and able to maintain confidentiality
